When we talk about the seasons...

We can use **past continuous**, **past simple**, **present continuous**, **present simple**, and we talk about things that happened, could or will happen (plans, memories etc). For example:

Last spring **I** was looking to buy a house. On winter I played hockey with my friends.

The trees are **withering** fast this fall. She **works** until summer.

We can use the seasons to describe something as well, normally by comparing:

She is like a winter's day

SPRING







During spring/springtime:

Flowers **bloom**

Days are longer and warmer

The birds **return**.

A lot of animals have babies.

Springtime is also associated with rebirth, renewal, regrowth.

SUMMER

During summer/summertime:

Exceptionally hot weather.

People tend to go on vacations.

Festivals take place around the world.

Summer time is also associated with growth and maturity, especially that of cultivated plants.









AUTUMN (UK)/FALL (US)



During fall or autumn:

Halloween takes place.

Plants and leaves from the trees start to change colors and fall.

A study shows that people born in autumn live longer.

Night and day are the same length.

Autumn is also associated with the beginning of the school season, holidays like Halloween and thanksgiving.
